

Flashpoint:

- Flashpoint - temperature of a fluid when it gives off enough vapor to burn in the presence of a flame.
- Flashpoint of fuels (must be below 400°F):
 - Used crankcase oil (340°F)
 - Used ATF (280°F)
 - Used hydraulic fluid (300°F)
 - Used gear oil (325°F)
 - Diesel fuel (125°F)
 - #2 fuel oil (100°F)
 - Synthetics and new crankcase oil (~400°F)
- MSDS sheets provide flashpoint
- EL fuel testing available: Contact EnergyLogic Technical Support for details.

To Burn or Not to Burn:

- Common Fuels to burn
 - Used crankcase oil (up to 90W)
 - Used ATF
 - Used hydraulic fluid
 - Used gear oil
 - Diesel fuel
 - #2 fuel oil
- Oils that cannot be burned
 - Oils with more than 10% water or antifreeze
 - Oils with chlorinated solvents
 - Oils that are silicone based
 - Extremely viscous oils (greater than 90W)
